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Faculty Senate Role in All New Degree Proposals

After individual departments have developed an initial degree proposal and secured support from the appropriate Division and Dean (as well as Advisory and/or Applied Baccalaureate Committees as needed), *the proposal is presented to Faculty Senate by the relevant Dean, Division or Department.*

Faculty Senate then serves as a conduit for campus-wide faculty voice and perspective in the process. Senators actively facilitate timely, constructive conversation with individuals/divisions to seek questions, comments, and input. Senate will provide a final recommendation to the Board, by vote or consensus, based on this feedback
