## **Faculty Senate Role in All New Degree Proposals**

After individual departments have developed an initial degree proposal and secured support from the appropriate Division and Dean (as well as Advisory and/or Applied Baccalaureate Committees as needed), the proposal is presented to Faculty Senate by the relevant Dean, Division or Department.

Faculty Senate then serves as a conduit for campus-wide faculty voice and perspective in the process. Senators actively facilitate timely, constructive conversation with individuals/divisions to seek questions, comments, and input. Senate will provide a final recommendation to the Board, by vote or consensus, based on this feedback
